Our team provides a comprehensive program that goes beyond basic needs, offering clinical and academic support, independent living skills, and social activities. This year, our dedication earned us a three-year CARF accreditation, which recognizes the quality of care and services we provide.

Two key initiatives we introduced this year are The Seven Challenges® Program and CATCH My Breath Vaping Prevention Program. Seven Challenges is a nationally recognized counseling program for addressing drug issues. CATCH My Breath is the only evidence-based nicotine vaping prevention program for youth in grades 5-12. With substance use being a growing concern, we are proud to support our residents with these programs, offering them healthier coping strategies for a substance-free future.

\$500


